Location

Akumal is situated on the eastern Caribbean coast of the Yucatan Peninsula, ninety kilometers south of Cancun, between the towns of Playa del Carmen and Tulum. Akumal means the "Place of Turtles" in Mayan.

What is CEA

Centro Ukana I Akumal A.C. better known as Centro Ecológico Akumal (CEA). It was founded in 1993, to provide environmental initiatives. The aim is to protect the marine and coastal ecosystems as well as biodiversity in Akumal. Since then, we have focused our efforts towards five main areas: investigation, monitoring, education, dissemination



and community outreach. These areas are bind together through our institutional programs and projects.

CEA, since its foundation, has developed alongside with the Akumal community on the following matters:

- Protection and preservation of the marine ecosystems
- Sea turtle protection, conservation and research
- Water quality issues
- Environmental education for locals and tourists
- Community outreach and volunteer engagement

In addition to its own independent research, CEA hosts visiting researchers and experts in various fields from around the world.

Environmental Education

The CEA supports a continuous educational program to teach the residents, the volunteers and the visitors how to preserve and respect the environment. In addition of working with local schools, we do activities to disseminate information inside the community.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Volunteers can help in the different environmental and social activities, and improve their skills, values and those of the beneficiaries, by making a difference forming a new culture of respect and love for the nature.

VOLUNTEER INTAKE

Environmental education classes run throughout the year; however, they follow the school calendar. Volunteers wishing to participate during school holidays can get involved in helping to create curriculum or event planning rather than classroom work.

Akumal Cero

The Akumal "Zero" program coexist within the Environmental Education coordination. Akumal Zero consists in promoting the municipal solid waste selective separations for citizens.

Its main objective is to create a collective consciousness about rescuing the recyclable waste that goes every day to the landfills and send them to recycle according to the existing regulations in the country.

The strategies that we use to accomplish this aim are talks, workshops, festivals and campaigns in schools, companies and for the Akumal residents.

Akumal Zero has three core focus areas to support the objective of having an Akumal without waste:

- Reduce and recycle waste.
- Improve and take action for the community.
- Green companies.

RECYCLE AND REDUCE OF WASTE

To minimize the amount of generated waste, it is very important to focus on guaranteeing that the recyclable products do not end in the garbage. To accomplish this, Akumal Zero will focus on:

- Create recyclable centers
- Create the service to collect the recyclable waste and special use
- Provide talks in schools, companies, and communitarian centers in and around Akumal, about how to recycle, reduce and reuse
- Composting workshops
- Campaigns to collect recyclable materials.
